Responses To Request For Qualifications For NASED Project Due May 12

The State of Hawaii released a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) document for the New Aloha Stadium and Entertainment District (NASED) on March 27. Development companies have until May 12 to submit a response listing their experience and qualifications with similar projects.

"We're very pleased with the level of interest we have received from experienced developers and construction industry experts about the RFQ document," said Chris Kinimaka, public works administrator for the State of Hawaii. "This bodes well for the NASED project and its prospects for identifying a highly qualified public-private partner (P3). I anticipate we'll have a strong pool of companies to consider."

A specially selected five-member committee that will identify up to three companies to receive a Request for Proposal (RFP), which is the next step in the process, will review responses. The state will then select a developer to collaborate with on the project, which will include a new stadium and a mixed-use entertainment district on the 98-acre site.

"What we need to remember is that while we are dealing with health matters during this challenging time of COVID-19, that doesn't mean projects that have been funded need to stop," State Representative Sylvia Luke told the Honolulu Star-Advertiser. "The Aloha Stadium project will be one of the economic drivers for the state, and because of that we need it more than ever before."

- Create an executable development plan for an urban entertainment destination that is community-centric and appropriate for Hawaii.
